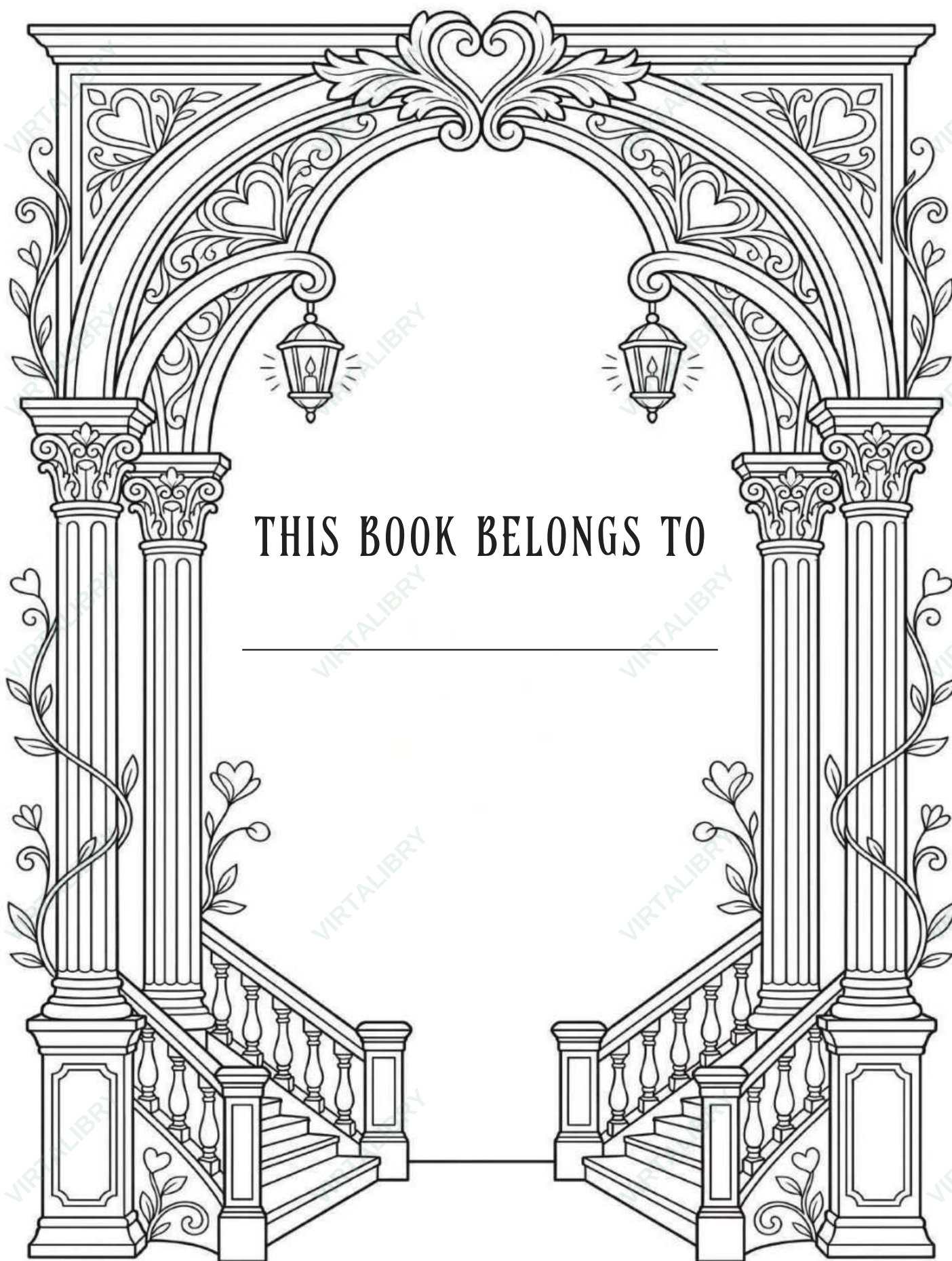

COLORING TIPS & PAPER CARE

TO HELP YOU ENJOY the best possible coloring experience, each illustration in this book is printed on its own page. This allows you to focus on one design at a time and helps reduce visible show-through from neighboring pages.

For best results, we recommend using dry coloring mediums such as colored pencils, gel pens, crayons, or fine liners. If you prefer to work with heavier pressure or layered color, placing a protective sheet of paper or cardstock behind the page you're coloring is suggested. This helps preserve the artwork beneath and keeps the pages in good condition.

If you enjoy testing colors or blending techniques, using a separate scrap sheet can be helpful before applying color to the illustration. Taking small steps allows you to build depth and detail gradually, enhancing both the process and the final result.
